Sumptuously ripe aromas of peach and apricot with a hint of toasty oak and smoke lead to full-bodied, sappy, muscular, massively scaled flavors that are breathtakingly rich and quite densely concentrated, especially on the impressively long finish and this stains and coats the palate completely. Despite all of the size, this remains impeccably balanced and as good as the La Cabotte is, the Montrachet delivers that extra dimension to surpass it by a nose, if you'll forgive the pun. Founded in 1731 in Beaune by Michel Bouchard, Bouchard Père &  ${\rm Fils}_7$  is one of the oldest wine estates in Burgundy, perpetuating tradition for nearly 3 centuries and 9 generations. This desire to build up an exceptional estate in Côte d'Or endured through the generations and acquisitions in the best Villages were added throughout the 19th century and again in the early 20th century. Today the estate boasts 130 hectares of vines, of which 12 are classed Grand Cru and 74 classed as Premier Cru.
